YOUTH MEDIA PROJECT AWARDED NATIONAL ENDOWMENT OF THE ARTS GRANT

Youth Media Project (YMP) was awarded its first National Endowment of the Arts (NEA) grant this December. It was one of 85 arts education programs across the nation awarded an Art Works grant to create a "New Media Arts Fellowship." This fellowship will develop a cadre of young professionals who will substantially increase the artistic reach of YMP's work with diverse educational partners across New Mexico.

Art Works grants support the creation of art that meets the highest standards of excellence: public engagement with diverse and excellent art, lifelong learning in the arts, and enhancing the livability of communities through the arts.

What is Youth Media Project?

Youth Media Project's (YMP) mission is to teach the craft of digital storytelling and the art of listening for a socially responsible world. YMP fosters creative and informed expression through educational partnerships that teach media literacy, radio production, broadcasting and reflective dialogue. The core of YMP's work is *Audio Revolution!*, a bi-monthly, hour-long radio show which broadcasts on public radio stations, heard throughout New Mexico and southern Colorado. Radio shows focus on relevant social issues, from local to global concerns through personal narratives, commentaries, interviews, panel discussions, spoken word, short documentaries and music. YMP directly serves between 500-700 students, families and educators each year and thousands more through radio broadcasts.
